- All PDI competitions have run well this year with no technical problems occurring.
- The licensing of the Zoom software was scaled back this season with coverage only being purchased to cover presentations where the speaker cannot visit the club.
This saved the club about £110 over purchasing an annual license.
In many cases, we were able to get additional use out of the one month licenses by covering photo clinics and home evenings that were timetabled within the license period.
- Full documentation on running club league and SCPF PDI competitions using the club's software was produced earlier this season. Thank you to Alan for successfully running PDI events while myself and Claude were away on holiday.
- Thanks to a recent grant of money, a new HP laptop has recently been purchased and will be in action running next season's PDI events. The current laptop still has good performance and will be retained to support events requiring multiple computers.

Member's Report - Jenny

Report from the Members Rep Jenny Hart May 2026

Most Members were very happy with the 2025 -2026 Season Programme. John has done a great job.

They liked the photo clinics, however some Members, new and old would welcome more training to improve.

The Special Interest' groups are very popular and going well and new members are welcome in Edit Group 1 and the Creative group, which is an 'online group' and does not have a numbers limit and welcomes members happy to participate and learn.

Complaints have been made regarding the club house ladies toilets which are shabby, doors don't lock and the flush does not work very well and sometimes not at all. This is bad for both members and Lady Judges who often come from far distances from clubs which have excellent facilities.

Complaints have been made about lack of chairs in the hall (we used to have more) and what we have are very uncomfortable.

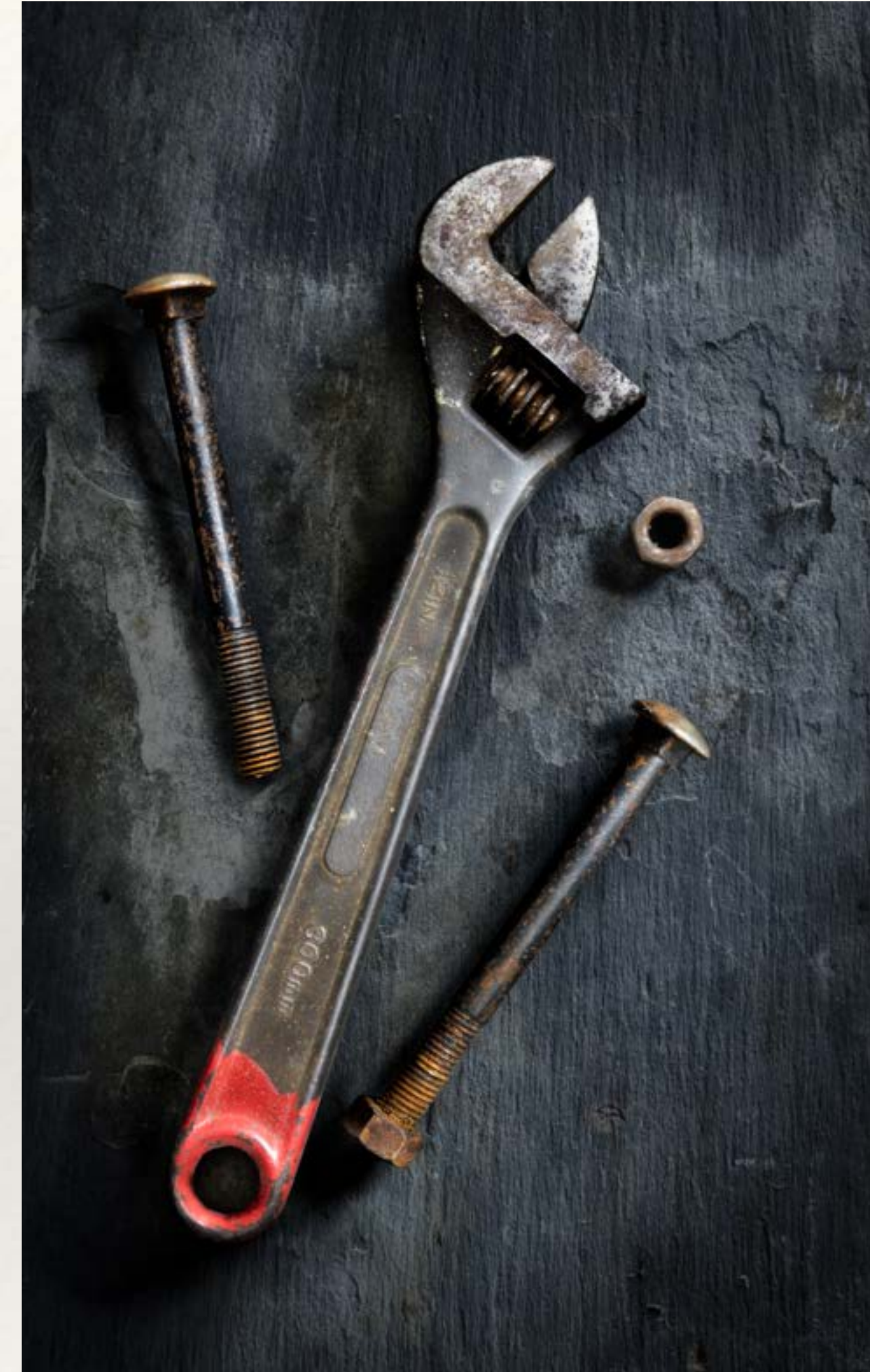

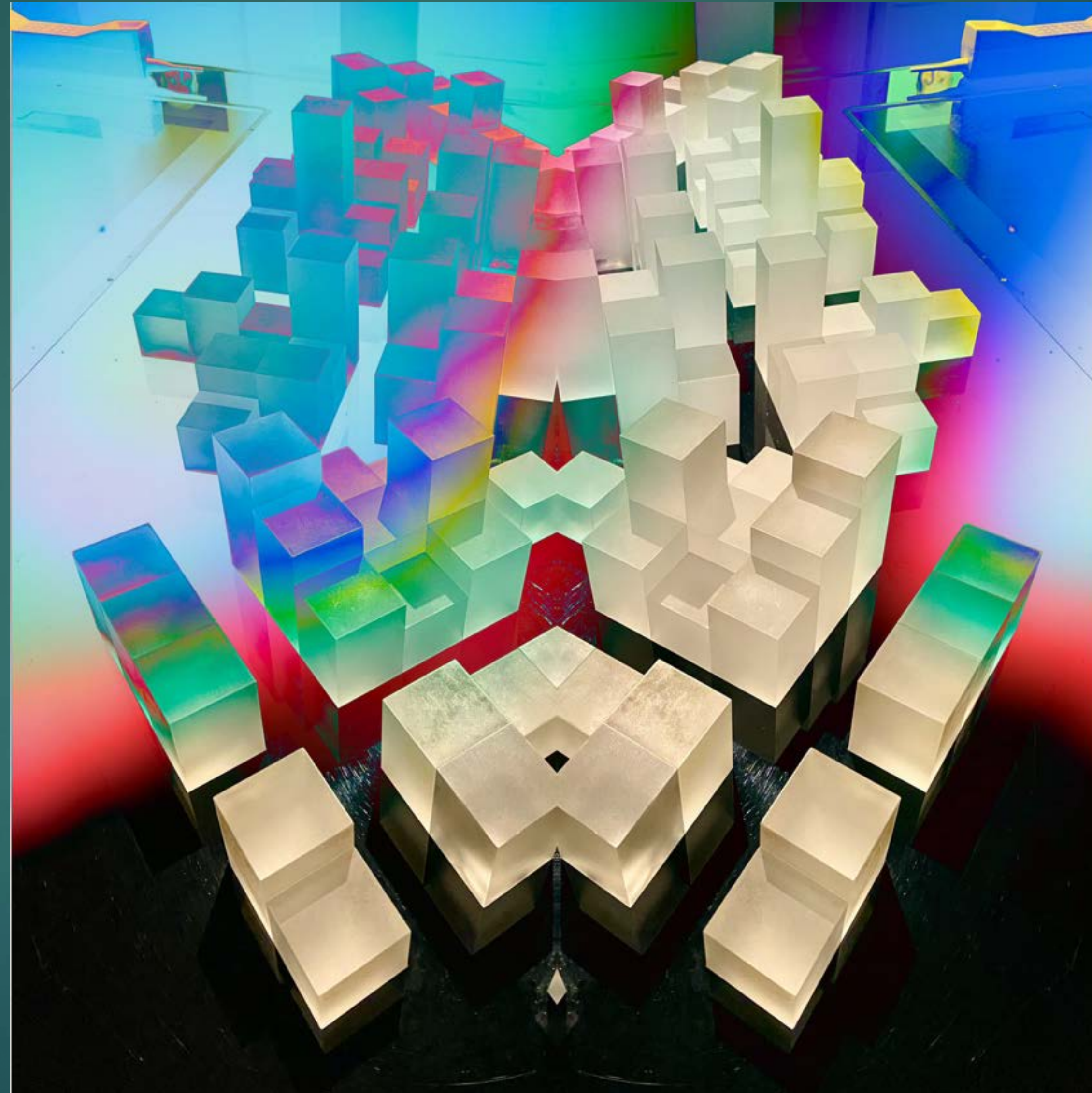

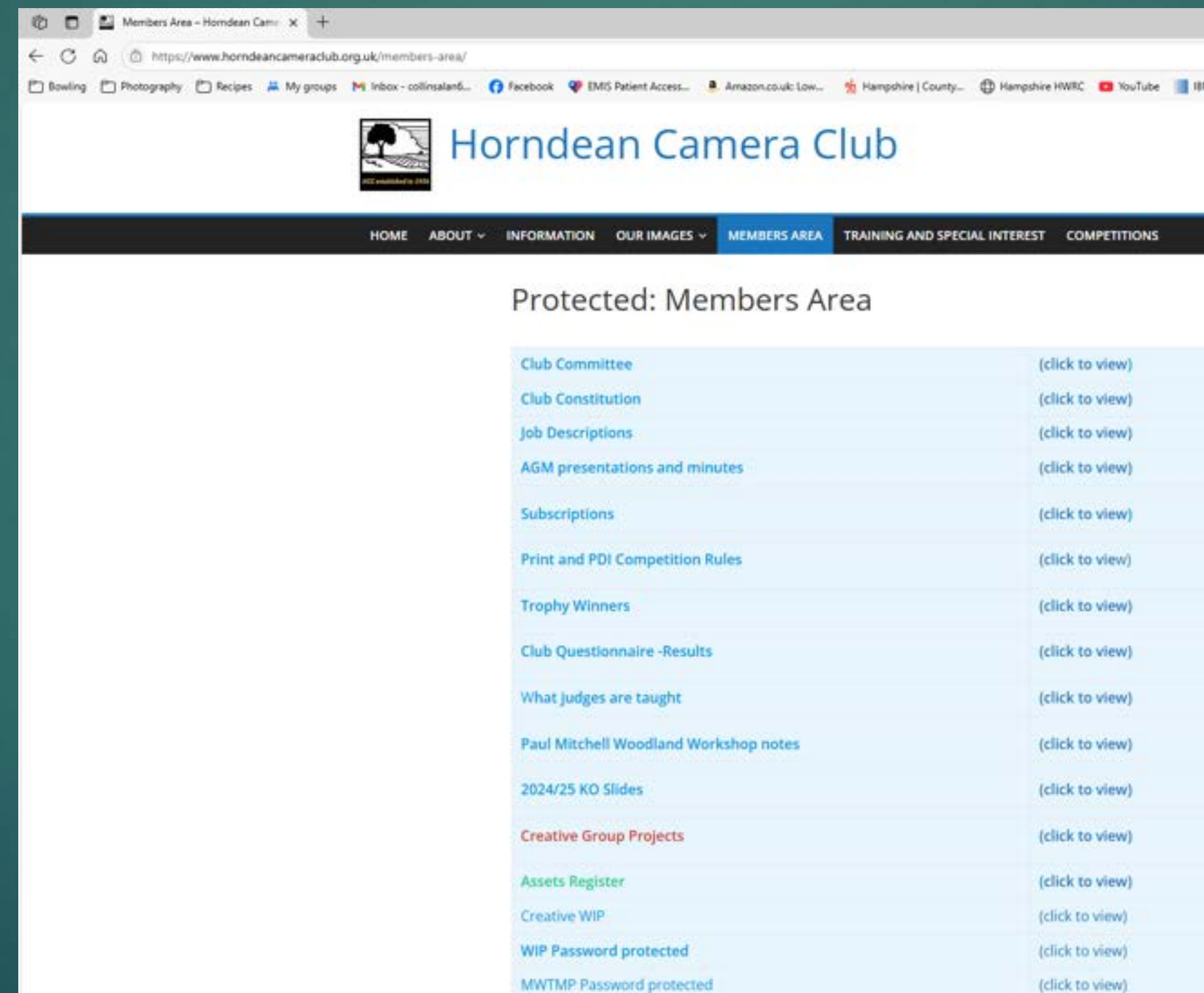

4. Selection Committee

A defined group that is responsible for selecting PDIs and Prints for external competitions, responsibilities to be advertised on the website.

5. Print League

Change the number of best print score to 10 from the currently used 7 to determine a member's aggregate score and position in the League.

Background

Currently member's total score in the Print League are based on the best 7 scores when a member can submit up to 18 prints (3 per competition) in a season. This means that just over 40% of the prints submitted are used to determine the member's aggregate score. If you consider the ratio of prints used to prints submitted when we could only submit 2 prints per competition you have $7/12$ (0.58). Taking this ratio of 0.58 and multiplying by the 18 prints we submit today you arrive at 10.44 so hence the logic of using the best 10 prints. In addition, if you examine the Club Competition Rules Section 6.7 states 'The winner of the respective League is determined by the entrant having the greatest total from their best 7 scores achieved (from a maximum of 12 entries) in that League.' As we now submit $3 \times 6 = 18$ prints we did not follow the Rules for this year's league competition!

6. PDI of the Year Competition

Do not provide a Preview / Run-through of Images prior to judging.

Background

As no opportunity is provided to the judges to view the Prints prior to judging a similar procedure should be followed for the PDI's to ensure a spontaneous score is provided by the judges. I think it would be time consuming and impractical to provide the judges the ability view the Prints before judging!

7. Print & PDI of the Year

When deciding tie breaks and overall winners, Judges of the Print & PDI of the year should vote without any discussion.

Too many times in past competitions a strong judge has been able to influence the other judges imposing his or her preference on the other judges. This year saw two judges discussing their favourites and overriding the 3rd judge. When choosing the overall PDI winner the same two judges were heard to say 'we have had our choice throughout the evening so you (3rd judge) can have your choice'. This was not a fair way to select the winners.
